This two-storey apartment required a total fit out of interiors.

To give this house the same strong personality of its owner the architect chose to mix a 50s style with oriental inspirations.

But this work was not just a re-thinking of interiors, it became a travel into building history and ancient handcrafted work...



Original mahogany paneling of the grand hall had survived intact. During restoration works under the moquette emerged the original wood-block flooring.

Special carpenter were employed to polish, paint and restore the wood – which has been brought back to a new life.





Floors in dining room and in one minor bedroom revealed original stone-mosaics, severely damaged in certain areas.

The restoration was done laying manually more than 20,000 tiles – a detail-oriented job, recreating the original style. All tiles received an ageing treatment, to soften differences.

Green and red Egyptian cobble needed to be replaced with another stone with same colours.





Airlie Garden

A typical terraced house in Notting Hill needs a restoration to make from basement and ground floor a unique apartment.





Basement main room had three windows facing the little terrace. The architect's new project planned the realization of one unique glass wall to provide more light to the room.



Facing this work we learnt that the way of building in our two countries are very different.

On the Southbank

Among the building sites we opened in London also some flats in Battersea area. Two high-rise buildings very different from each other.





Sparkford house is a 21-storey-building erected in late 60s. A formerly local authority tower with a breathtaking view on the River Thames.

This is a two-bedroom flat still in original conditions, which undergo a severe internal restoration to offer modern services and comfort.

Battersea Rach is the new, stylish residential area on the riverside. An exclusive group of building offering boutique apartments and penthouses surrounded by gardens and boutiques.

Starting from the stunning high-specification design we worked on the finishing for two apartments facing the river. Wallpaper laying, tailor made furniture, stylish details – just little touches to give more personality.



Pelham Crescent

A new beginning. This is a brand new work we begun just a few days ago. The building is a typical Terraced house in a very elegant area.
